This is in response to your August 29, 1994, letter requesting Federal Aviation Administration (FAA) authorization to identify Survivor Locator Light Model No. MS-2000, in accordance with the requirements of Federal Aviation Regulations (FAR) Part 21, Subpart 0, and Technical Standard Order (TSO) marking TSO C85.
